- Other attractions: helicopter flights, camel rides

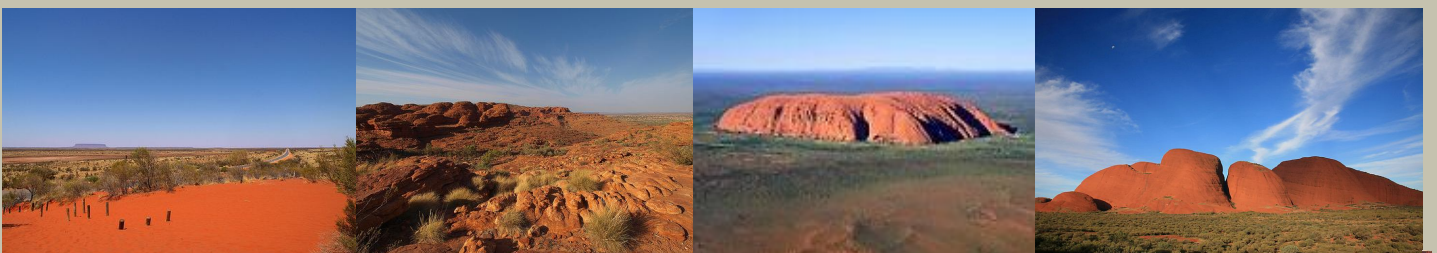
Accommodation
